Rev. Sam Jones Dead.

Rev. Sam Jones, the famous evangelist, died on a Choctaw train near Little Rock, Ark., on Monday morning. He was on his way to fill an appointment and was found dead in the birth of the sleeper by the porter.

The sudden death of the great preacher came as a shock to the entire country, as it was not even known that he was in ill health.

The death of Sam Jones marks the passing of the last preacher of inter-national reputation in America. He had addressed perhaps more people than any other living man. His quaint, original style won for him attention wherever he went, and no man is more frequently quoted than Sam Jones. The world loses a man of great intellect; warm generous heart and fearless character.

Asylum Attendants Indicted.

The grand jury at Lexington, returned a joint indictment against Fred Pharris, Richard Champion, Daniel Addams and J. M. Claggett, charging them with the wilful murder of Fred Ketter, an inmate of the Eastern Kentucky Asylum. The indictment charges that Fred Ketter was beaten to death by the defendants on or prior to June 22 last. That said defendants used their fists and blunt instruments unknown to the jury.

The trial of these men will doubtless bring more clearly before the public the manner in which the asylum is conducted from the inside. The indictment is a sequel to the investigations by the State Board of Control a few weeks ago, following charges preferred by J. Franklin Wallace, former attendant at the asylum.

The Bushel in Kentucky.

Section 4821 of the Kentucky Statutes says:

The following weights constitute a bushel of each article named respectively:

- Wheat, 60 pounds.
- Shelled corn, 56 pounds.
- Corn in the ear, 70 pounds; November 1st to May 1st, following, and from May 1st to November 1st following, 68 pounds.
- Rye, 56 pounds.
- Oats, shelled, 32 pounds.
- Barley, 47 pounds.
- Irish potatoes, 60 pounds.
- Sweet potatoes, 55 pounds.
- White beans, 60 pounds.
- Castor beans, 45 pounds.
- Clover seed, 60 pounds.
- Timothy, 45 pounds.
- Flax, 56 pounds.
- Millet seed, 50 pounds.
- Peas, 60 pounds.
- Bluegrass seed, 11 pounds.
- Dried apples, 24 pounds.
- Dried peaches, 30 pounds.
- Onions, 37 pounds.
- Bottom onion sets, 36 pounds.
- Salt, 50 pounds.
- Stone coal, 75 pounds. (The term coal includes anthracite, cannel, bituminous and other mined coal.)
- Bran, 20 pounds.
- Plastering hair, 8 pounds.
- Turnips, 60 pounds.
- Unshelled lime, 35 pounds.
- Corn meal, 50 pounds.
- Fine salt, 55 pounds.
- Hungarian grass seed, 50 pounds.
- Ground peas, 24 pounds.
- Orchard grass seed, 14 pounds.
- English bluegrass seed, 11 pounds.
- Hemp seed, 4 pounds.


