United States Internal Revenue, Collector's Office, 7th District of Kentucky.

LEXINGTON, KY., June 1, 1891. To special tax-payers and persons required to register in the Seventh District of Kentucky:

Special tax-payers are advised that their extension certificates, or special tax stamps, for the months of May and June expire on June 30, 1891.

Section 3232 U. S. Revised Statutes reads as follows: "No person shall be engaged in or carry on any trade or business hereinafter mentioned until he has paid a special tax therefor in the manner hereinafter provided."

It has been decided in the United States Courts that all returns required from special tax-payers must be made, and that the required amount must be paid in advance...

Only bankers' drafts, post-office or express money-orders, or currency will be received in payment of special taxes. Postage stamps will not be received.

Returns for special tax on form 11 may be made before, and the necessary amount of special tax may be paid to the Deputy Collectors of their respective divisions, wherever it may be convenient to do so.

If Mr. and Mrs. Cleveland do not go to Marion this season it will be because they want to escape the pestering to which they were subjected by inquisitive reporters last year...


One of the smartest of the bride-maids' gowns is of dove gray corduroy cloth. The skirt is quite plainly made, and has a slight train.
