HORSE AND TRACK.

Mr. James Heber, of New York, was registered at the Phoenix Hotel last week. He shipped a carload of seven horses to Ferandina, near Jacksonville, Florida, early last week. Mr. Heber finds a market for Kentucky horses in Florida for the use of Northern people who go there for the winter. He purchased the horses at good prices from various places in the Blue Grass and will return here in two weeks for a consignment which he will ship to New York. Mr. Heber says that the finest horses he has ever seen are Kentucky horses and that this State has the best horsemen. He expects hereafter to make frequent visits to Kentucky for the purpose of buying horses.—Lexington Herald.

Diodene 2:10 $\frac{1}{2}$, by Diablo, was the highest-priced performer sold at the Splan sale held last week in the Coliseum, Chicago, her price being \$2,050.

If the recommendations of the joint committee are accepted by the Biennial Congresses of the National and American Trotting Associations the distance flag will hereafter fall at the seventy-yard mark when less than eight horses start and at the eighty-yard mark when eight or more horses start. A provision of the rule will be that no association shall have power or liberty to change these distances, as was done in times gone by, when a reform of this sort was tried.

Against Kentucky Oil.

The Standard Oil Company has shown its antagonistic policy toward the Kentucky oil producers by forcing low prices for Kentucky oil, first to 74 and now to 69 cents, while paying over a dollar for the same grade of oil in Pennsylvania, and in spite of the fact that the entire production of crude oil is so far from meeting the demands that the Standard's surplus stock is being steadily drawn upon.

Buy a Cemetery.

The R. J. Breckinridge Camp of Confederate veterans, of Danville, have by subscriptions purchased the Confederate cemetery of the Perryville battlefield, in which 480 soldiers are buried. A bill is now pending before the legislature for an appropriation of \$2,000 to improve the grounds.

Waste of Money.

A grave scandal has developed in the British War Office, it being charged that there has been a tremendous waste of the people's money, and that millions have gone into the pockets of horse buyers for the South African troops.

Could Not Give Bond.

John Burgett, of Magoffin county, was arrested and brought before United States Commissioner Cisco, charged with selling whisky without license, and was held in the sum of \$500. Failing to give bond, he is in jail at West Liberty.
