STUDENTS AT STATE FORM CLUB

Its Purpose Is to Encourage Keeping in Touch With Governmental Affairs.

The Democratic students of the State University have formed a Democratic club, which is composed of 150 legal voters and about as many others who are yet minors, but who were "rocked in a Democratic cradle," and are enthusiastic supporters of Democracy. The club is to be one of the permanent organizations of the university and is to be known as "The Democratic Club of Kentucky State University."

The purpose of the club is to encourage a political spirit among the students, a number of the members being students of the College of Law, who probably will devote a part of their time during campaigns to speech-making, and to encourage students in keeping in close touch with governmental affairs in the nation, state and city. It is patterned after the famous Democratic clubs at Harvard, Yale and other universities, and it is the hope of the charter members of the organization that its members may eventually do the work for Kentucky that has been, and is now being done by similar organizations in other states.
