SADDLE HORSE NEWS.

Woodford Stock Farm, of Mt. Sterling, Ky., shipped the past week by Adams express to W. F. Hart, of Elizabeth, Colorado, a bay yearling colt by Sterling Chief, dam by Forest Denmark. The colt was a well-bred youngster and a good individual.

Emerald LeGrand, owned by James Anderson, of Montgomery county, Ky., was sold Saturday to A. B. Setters for \$111. The colt is one of the best-bred ones in the country, being by Star Emerald and out of a mare by Stephens LeGrand and is a good individual and bears all the earmarks of a show horse, but Mr. Anderson had so many of them that he sacrificed the colt in order to make room for some young stuff coming on. The colt is two years old.

Bridges Brothers, of Montgomery county, Ky., have leased their young stallion, King Royal, to a Mr. Walton, of Fleming county, Ky., and this horse will make the season in that county. King Royal is a well-bred stallion, of fine style and good confirmation and is siring some fine colts, and the owners of good mares in that county should feel honored in having the stallion with them for the season of 1913.

Clarence L. Kerr, of Lexington, sold the past week to J. F. Pontotoc, Oklahoma, the fine gaited stallion, Jungle Chief, 4790, by Dandy Jim, out of the show mare, Kate Cronwell, by Eric Chief. The price paid was private, but was reported to be in the neighborhood of \$2,500. Jungle Chief is an excellent prospect for a show horse and will be campaigned by his new owner at the Western horse shows and fairs.

Messrs. Charles L. Railey and Elmer Railey, of Lexington, Ky., were here during the past week looking over some good prospects with a view of making some purchases. They were highly pleased with the horses they saw, and it is likely that some of the horses will soon become the property of these astute horsemen, who always come to Montgomery county when they are in the market for something good.

Arrington Johnson has just returned from Island, Va., where he delivered the stallion Scottish Chief, that was sold by Mr. Johnson for Ray Moss to Mr. A. M. Boggs, of Island, last fall. Scottish Chief was sired by Bourbon Chief, dam by McDonald Chief, and is a great young stallion with a brilliant prospect in front of him. He may be shown some the coming season.—Blue Grass Journal.


