WHERE WE VOTE.

The New Precincts as Arranged by the County Judge.

Under the new election law County Judge B. G. Williams has divided the county up into new voting precincts, and in order that our country friends may have an idea of the boundary of the precincts in which they live, we give below a map of the county, drawn by D. M. Woodson, Esq., civil engineer, and engraved upon metal by Mr. B. Todd Crutcher, showing the divisions made by Judge Williams. We have not thought it necessary to give a diagram of the city precincts, as the dividing lines are so clearly stated that no matter how

cross the hills to Holt's Corner, taking Llewellyn Marshall with them, if they wish to be "in it" when election day rolls around. Benson is no longer a voting place, and Col. Dave and Squire Dan will have to go to the bushes to drop their ballots; Woodlake robs the Forks of one of its principal attractions, and Bloomington and Switzer will have no more fun with the festive floater at the polls. It is considerable of a shake up and will put many to great inconvenience, but the Judge says he tried to comply with the law, and in so doing could not please every one.

If you wish to know how the magisterial districts are divided just remember that the city of Frankfort is divided into five districts. Then look at the map and put precincts marked G and H together you have district No. 2; E and F constitute district No. 3; C and D district No. 4, and B. and I No. 5. In laying off the voting precincts, the law forbids the county judge crossing the lines of the magisterial districts, which renders the work no easy matter.

We give below the order of the courts:

FRANKLIN COUNTY COURT, TUESDAY, August 22, 1892. ELECTION PRECINCTS.

In pursuance to chapter 65, entitled "An Act to regulate elections in this Commonwealth," approved June 30, 1892, and in conformity thereto, the following boundaries and voting precincts are established, viz:

All that portion of South Frankfort east of Shelby street to be designated as precinct No. 1, of Magisterial District No. 1. And it is further ordered that the voting place for said precinct be at Vogler's store in South Frankfort.

All that portion of South Frankfort west of Shelby street is designated a precinct No. 2 of Magisterial District No. 1. And it is further ordered

No. 1, on Elkhorn; thence continuing with the Magisterial District division line to the Scott county line; thence with the same to the Woodford and Scott county corner; thence with the Woodford county line to the L. & N. R. R.; thence in a straight line to Macklin's mill-dam on South Elkhorn; thence down the same to the Forks; thence down main Elkhorn to the beginning. And it is further ordered that the voting place for said precinct be at Woodlake.

Precinct No. 1 of Magisterial District No. 3 is all that portion of Magisterial District No. 3 east and north of Main Elkhorn and north of precinct No. 2, of Magisterial District No. 2. And it is further ordered that the voting place for said precinct be at Peak's Mill.

Precinct No. 2 of Magisterial District No. 3 is all that portion embraced between the Kentucky river and Elkhorn and north of precinct No. 1 of Magisterial District No. 2. And it is further ordered that the voting place for said precinct be at the junction of the county road and Owenton Turnpike near corner of J. A. Holt, on Owenton pike.

Precinct No. 1 of Magisterial District No. 4 is bounded as follows: Beginning at the mouth of Steamboat hollow, on the Kentucky river; thence up the same to the ridge road leading to Pleasant Ridge Church; thence with ridge around to the point where the Flat Creek pike crosses it; thence in a straight line to the Stony Creek crossing of the Plumb Branch and Bald Knob pike; thence in a straight line to the railroad bridge over Benson, near the old Ganey bridge; thence with the L. & N. Railroad to the city limits of Frankfort on the Kentucky river; thence down the river bank to the place of beginning. And it is further ordered that the voting place for said precinct be at Bellepoint.

Precinct No. 2 of Magisterial District No. 4 is bounded as follows: Beginning at the L. & N. Railroad bridge over Benson, near the old Ganey bridge; thence with line of precinct No. 1 to point where the Flat Creek pike crosses the dividing ridge between Davis and Marshall's branches; thence in a straight line to the Shelby and Franklin county corner, near Bailey's mill; thence with the Shelby county line to its intersection with the L. & N. Railroad; thence with said railroad to the place of beginning. And it is further ordered that the voting place for said precinct be at the school-house on Tad Pole branch.

Precinct No. 3 of Magisterial District No. 4 is bounded as follows: Beginning at the mouth of Steamboat hollow; thence with a line of precinct No. 1 to the Flat Creek pike on dividing ridge as before described; thence with a line of precinct No. 2 to the Shelby and Franklin county corner; thence with Shelby line to the Henry county corner; thence with the Henry county line to the Kentucky river; thence up the same to the place of beginning. And it is further ordered that the voting place for said precinct be at the school-house on Tad Pole branch.

Precinct No. 1 of Magisterial District No. 5 is bounded as follows, viz: Beginning at the L. & N. railroad bridge across the Kentucky river; thence with said railroad to the Shelby county line; thence with Shelby and Anderson county line to the present precinct line between Bridgeport and Cedar Run; thence with the same to the junction of the county road with the Louisville turnpike near Butler Branch's; thence with the Louisville turnpike to the city limits to the place of beginning. And it is further ordered that the voting place for said precinct be at Bridgeport.


Precinct No. 2 of Magisterial District No. 5 is bounded as follows, viz: Beginning at the city limits of Frankfort on the bank of the Kentucky river; thence up the river to the Anderson county line; thence with the same to the present precinct line between Bridgeport and Cedar Run precincts; thence with the same to the junction of the county road with the Louisville turnpike near Butler Branch's; thence with the Louisville turnpike to the city limits of Frankfort; thence with the city limits to the place of beginning. And it is further ordered that the voting place for said precinct be at Cedar Run school-house.

Precinct Meetings.

Democratic meetings will be held in the several precincts of this county to-day to select delegates to the County Convention which meets in this city next Saturday for the purpose of electing delegates to represent the county in the District Convention, which meets at Georgetown on Thursday, August 25th, to nominate a candidate for Circuit Judge and Commonwealth's Attorney.

A Great Game To-day.

There will be one of the greatest games of base ball of the season played at Lake Park this afternoon. The contestants will be the Highlands, of Louisville, composed of the pick of the amateur clubs of that city, and the Frankfort Club. The game will be called at 4 o'clock so that the lovers of the game, who quit work at that hour on Saturday, can have a chance to see the fun. Our boys have defeated every club sent up from the city so far, and the Highlands will do their level best to do them up.

drunk a man gets on election day he can hardly fail to find his voting place, if he does not forget where he lives.

The principal changes within the city limits are the making of two precincts in South Frankfort, with Shelby street as the dividing line, and the taking of the three squares bounded by St. Clair street on the east, the river on the west, Broadway on the north and Main street on the south, out of the Crow precinct and adding them to the Court-House.

When we go outside the city limits in any direction except Bellepoint the fun begins. Our little neighbor at the mouth of Benson is given a voting place, and a number of their country friends out on the Flat Creek, Blumb Branch and St. John's pikes come in and vote with them, but the residents of High View, who can stand in their door yards and cast a stone into the streets of Bellepoint, must mount their bicycles and, together with Bob Nicol and others residing south of the railroad, as far west as the Shelby line, go out to Bridgeport if they wish to drop a ballot in the slot. Hon. E. H. Taylor, jr., Uncle Jim Richardson, J. H. Williamson, Charley Lang and their neighbors, who have heretofore voted at the Court House, must now journey to Purinton to cast their suffrage; the residents of Spring Hill, Trumbo's Bottom, Jett, Stedmantown, and those who live this side of the creek at the Forks, will congregate at the school-house near Green's toll-gate to drop in their votes, and Col. Jim Murray and his neighbors at the Hemp Mill and in Lecstown must

that the voting place for said precinct be at bridge toll-house, South Frankfort.

All that portion of North Frankfort south of the Versailles turnpike and Main street as far as St. Clair street; thence north on St. Clair street to Broadway; thence west on Broadway street to the Kentucky River, be designated as precinct No. 3 of Magisterial District No. 1. And it is further ordered that the voting place for said precinct be at the court-house in the city of Frankfort.

All that portion of North Frankfort east of St. Clair street and north of Main street and Versailles turnpike be designated as precinct No. 4 of Magisterial District No. 1. And it is further ordered that the voting place for said precinct be at the Market House in the city of Frankfort.

All that portion of North Frankfort west of St. Clair street and north of Broadway street be designated as precinct No. 5 of Magisterial District No. 1. And it is further ordered that the voting place for said precinct be at the Gas House in the city of Frankfort.

Precinct No. 1 of Magisterial District No. 2 is bounded as follows: Beginning at the city limits of Frankfort on the Owenton pike; thence with said pike to its junction with Peak's Mill pike; thence with the same or with the Magisterial District division line to Elkhorn; thence up the same to its forks; thence up the South Fork to Macklin's mill-dam; thence a straight line to the intersection of the L. & N. R. R. with the Woodford county line; thence with the same to the Kentucky River; thence down the same to the city limits of Frankfort; thence with the line of same to the place of beginning. And it is further ordered that the voting place of said precinct be at the school-house near the forks of the Georgetown and Versailles turnpike.

Precinct No. 2 of Magisterial District No. 2 is bounded as follows: Beginning at the corner of precinct
