

Deaths.

ARMSTRONG—Mr. Manual Armstrong, an old resident of this county, died on Friday of last week at his home near Bridgeport, aged 70 years. The deceased was an uncle of Sheriff R. D. Armstrong. The funeral took place Saturday afternoon, and the remains were interred in the family burying ground.

DEHONEY—Mrs. Laura Wingate Dehoney, wife of W. S. Dehoney, Esq., died Thursday night about 12 o'clock, after an illness of one week's duration, aged 57 years. The deceased had been in delicate health for a long time, but was not confined to bed until Thursday of last week, when she was taken suddenly ill. From the first there was no hope except that entertained by the loving hearts hovering about her bedside—praying that she might be spared to them for years to come. She was an affectionate wife, kind and indul-

gent mother, and had been for many years a member of the Baptist Church, and to her death had no terrors. As her life had been quiet and peaceful, so was her death—as gentle as the sleep of an infant. She leaves three children—Mr. Richard Dehoney, of St. Louis, Dr. Howard Dehoney, of Philadelphia, and Miss Janie Dehoney, of this city—with a devoted husband to mourn her loss, to whom the hearts of a large circle of relatives and friends go out in tenderest sympathy.

The funeral will take place this afternoon at 3:30 o'clock, from the residence of her husband, 444 Main street. The services will be conducted by Rev. W. C. Taylor, of the Baptist Church.

GILTNER—A telegram was received by relatives in this city yesterday morning announcing the death of Mrs. Lizzie Giltner, wife of Rev. W. S. Giltner, for many years president of Eminence College. The sad event occurred at the home of her husband in Eminence Thursday night and the funeral will take place this morning at 11 o'clock.

MAYHALL—Judge John Mayhall, brother of the late T. J. Mayhall, of this city, died at his home at New Maysville, Indiana, on May 28th, aged 84 years. The deceased was born and raised in this county, and was the last but one of a family of twelve children—Mrs. Jas. R. Watson, of Louisville, being the only survivor. He was a kind hearted and worthy man.

WAGGONER—Mrs. Mary A. Waggoner, formerly of this city, died at the residence of her son, on June 3d, of congestive chills, after an illness of two days, aged 72 years and 8 months. She was a native of Ohio but has resided for 17 years in Kentucky. She was a consistent member of the Baptist Church since her 17th year, and was a widow for thirty years. Her funeral took place from the Baptist Church, June 5th, at 4 o'clock, and she was laid to rest by the loving hands of son and daughter and many friends, in Frankfort's beautiful cemetery.
