A RECENT paragraph in THE NEWS alluded to January 1st, 1874, as an extremely cold day, there being a change of seventy degrees on the night of Dec. 31st, 1863. The paragraph as published elicited the following from Mr. H. F. Hillemeier, the well-known nurseryman of Lexington, who is a close observer of the weather, having carefully recorded its various phases for a period covering nearly half a century.
