### STOCK AND TURF NEWS.

Sales and Transfers of Stock, Crop, Etc.—Turf Notes.

Jonas Weil has bought a bunch of 1,100-lb. cattle from J. E. Lynn, of Lincoln, at \$3.55 per cwt. They were delivered last week.

It is reported that John Madden, of Lexington, has offered \$3,000 for Typhoon II, a second choice in the Kentucky Derby. J. C. Coon, the owner, refused the offer.

At Louisville Wednesday twenty-six hogsheads of Bourbon county new leaf tobacco sold at \$12.25 to \$7.90. 25 hds. new lugs at 6.50 to \$4.30; 15 hds. new trash at \$3.80.

Peter Durga, of New York, has offered C. W. Williams \$30,000 for the stallion, Allerton, 2:09. The offer was refused. L. G. Tewksberry has refused \$25,000 for John R. Gentry.

Henry A. Fleischmann, Bernard Polak and Joseph Wesner, of Vienna, Austria, are attending the horse sales at Lexington. At Fasig's recent sale these foreigners bought \$89,000 worth of horses and sent them to Vienna.

At the meeting of the National Saddle-Horse Breeder's Association, held in Louisville Tuesday, the following officers were elected: President, Col. John B. Castleman, of Louisville; First Vice President, Prof. T. J. Doolan, Finchville; Second Vice President, Capt. Will A. Gaines, Georgetown; Secretary, I. B. Nall, Louisville; Treasurer, Attila Cox, Louisville. In the future no dividends will be declared, but all funds will be devoted to the advancement of saddle-horse interests.
