Chesapeake and Ohio Ry's New Entrance To New York.
 ONE of the greatest improvements ever made for the convenience of passengers to and from New York City has just been completed. A new highspeed Ferry service has been established from big Jersey City depot to the foot of 23d street in New York City, where a handsome Ferry House has been erected, with commodious waiting rooms, baggage room and all conveniences of a modern Union Depot.

The Ferris used between Jersey City and 23d street are just from the ship builder, and all that can be embodied in modern up-to-date passenger steamers. They are large "double deckers," and the landings on both sides of the river are so constructed that passengers can get aboard or ashore from both docks at once, thus saving the trouble and annoyance of going up or down a crowded stairway.
 In connection with the 23d street station a line of hansoms and carriages has been established that will take passengers to or from any part of New York City, a charge of 25 cents per passenger for a mile and a half under, and 12 cents for each additional mile or fraction. Trunks will be taken with passengers in four wheel carriages at 10 cents each. The charge for passengers or carriages by driver in either hansom or carriage at 5 cents each; no charge for valises carried in hand.
 This new station is in addition to the Courtland and DeBrosses street stations these are still in use for persons going direct to the lower, or business end of New York City, but for persons desiring to go first to the hotel district the 23d street station fills every need.
