Agreement Between City and County.

BELOW is printed a copy (taken from County records) of the agreement between the County of Bourbon and the City of Paris, regarding the keeping in repair of Main street and the termini of the several turnpikes owned by the county:

This agreement made, this 11th day of October, 1897, by and between the Bourbon Fiscal Court and the City of Paris, Kentucky, witnesseth:

The Bourbon Fiscal Court, by way of carrying out the contract between the Maysville & Lexington Turnpike-road Company and the Trustees of the town of Paris and the City of Paris, and in consideration of the transfer and delivery to the Bourbon Fiscal Court of forty (40) shares of the capital stock of the Maysville & Lexington Turnpike-road Company by the City of Paris, agrees to put in proper condition with crushed rock the Main street of the City of Paris and to put in proper condition and to keep in proper condition the bridge and its approaches on said street over Stoner Creek, and to put in proper condition and to keep in proper condition that part of the Paris & Georgetown pike extending to High street, Paris & Winchester pike extending to L. & N. railroad, Paris & North Middle-town pike extending to Maysville & Lexington pike and Paris & Peacock pike extending to the bridge across Houston Creek, all of the termini of said roads being located within the limits of the City of Paris. The City of Paris reserving and retaining the right to put down and maintain crossings and is to have full control of the gutters, or ditches extending along said streets or roads above named within its limits; and reserving the jurisdiction for all purposes over said streets and roads now conferred by law upon the City of Paris.

If at any time, future legislation shall exempt the City of Paris from road tax for county purposes this contract shall no longer be obligatory upon the Fiscal Court of Bourbon County.


