#### Democratic Convention Call.

In obedience to a call of the State Executive Committee, there will be a mass meeting of the Democrats of Bourbon county, in the court house, Saturday, June 9th, at two o'clock p. m., standard time, for the purpose of selecting delegates to the State Convention, which is to be held in Louisville, June 14th, which will select delegates to the National Democratic Convention, to be held in Kansas City, July 4th, 1900, to nominate candidates for President and Vice President. All persons who subscribe to the following principles are invited to participate in said mass convention. The basis of representation shall be one delegate for each 300 votes cast for W. J. Bryan in 1896, which entitles this county to eleven votes.

"All persons who will at the November election, 1900, be legal voters in this State, who are devoted to the principles of the Democratic party and desire to see those principles succeed, and who by participating in the mass meetings will feel in honor bound to support the nominees of the Democratic National Convention, shall have the right and are hereby invited to participate in the said meetings.

"The Democrats of Kentucky are a law-abiding and a peace-loving people. They would welcome, not repel, from their associations those Kentuckians who love liberty and justice and who hate crime. Under Republican rule the civil arm of the State Government was struck down, and a military usurpation was set up in its place. Under Republican rule murder was made a weapon of party warfare, and Republican officials obstructed and defied the courts in their effort to discover and punish its authors. In view of these things, we invite every Kentuckian who remains a true Kentuckian and without regard to former political affiliations to join with us in stamping out their possible recurrence, and to share with us the glory of redeeming the honor of the State and surviving the memory of the patriots and sages, who in the better days, made it prosperous, illustrious and happy."

#### Political Topics.

James J. Coogan, a Tammany leader, has contributed \$100,000 to the Democratic National Committee, with a stipulation that it shall be rescinded if Mr. Bryan is not nominated.

The credentials of J. C. S. Blackburn as a Senator from Kentucky for the term beginning March 4, 1901, were presented to the Senate yesterday. They were signed by Gov. J. C. W. Beckham and were read and filed without comment.

Chief Justice Hazelrigg, of the Court of Appeals, Saturday authorized the statement that he will not be a candidate for Governor. Upon his retirement from the bench, Judge Hazelrigg will return to the practice of his profession.

All Democratic members of the Kentucky delegation in Congress who are in Washington indorse Senator Blackburn's attitude in urging that the Kentucky election law shall be revised so as to make it more equitable, except Representative Wheeler who is opposed to a "Retreat."

Congressman June Gayle in an interview Saturday said it was almost certain that the Seventh District Congressional Committee would meet in a few days and rescind the rule which permitted only Democrats who is voted for Goebel to participate in the Congressional primary. The committee is expected to meet this week.


