Some Old Relics.

Col. Jno. Cunningham, one of the "Noble Old Romans," of Bourbon county, has at his country home, "Rosedale," near Escandia, a beautifully carved hardwood flax spinning wheel which has descended to him from its original owners of ninety years ago. The wheel was made by the great-grandfather of Judge James Hazelrigg, ex-Chief Justice of the Court of Appeals, for Miss Mary Bean, then fifteen years of age. Miss Bean afterwards became the wife of Senator John Cunningham, and was the mother of Col. John Cunningham, the present possessor of the wheel. Another interesting relic of the olden days is a clock made by Thomas and B. B. Marsh, of Paris, in 1838, and now owned by Mr. S. B. Ewalt, of Paris. "Uncle Sam" prizes the old time-piece very highly. It is nine feet in height, keeps the moon's phases and day of the month correctly. The clock had never been moved from the old Ewalt farm until recently, and had not been wound since the death of Mr. Ewalt's father, which occurred in 1878. A local jeweler went out to the farm, brought the clock to town and cleaned and repaired it. Since then it has kept time remarkably well. Every part of the venerable old time keeper was made by hand.
