#### The Firemen's Convention.

The Firemen's Convention to be held in this city on next Wednesday and Thursday, will in all probability, attract a good crowd to town, as the exhibitions to be given by the fire laddies will be worth seeing. The exhibitions of the various fire departments will take place on the public square.

The Paris Fire Department have closed a deal with a large carnival company and will hold a street fair in this city during the meeting of the Firemen's Association. A baloon ascension will be made from the Court House yard on one of the days of the meeting. The line of attractions to be presented by the carnival company are all new and up-to-date and should attract a large crowd. The right of way of all the public square has been granted the at ractions.

Chief George W. Muir, of the Lexington fire department, selected the five local firemen who will accompany him to the Paris Firemen's Convention. The method by which he selected the men was both a fair and unique one. So as not to show any partiality to any of the men he decided that the fireman who climbed the sixty-foot ladder in the shortest space of time could be the ones to attend the meeting.

About 2:30 o'clock most of the firemen assembled in front of the department. A ladder was placed against the building and preparations made for the climbing contest. A large crowd by this time had assembled to see the fun.
