PEACE IS RESTORED.

The Long Revolution in Colombia is About Ended.

Panama, Nov. 22.—Consul General Guder landed from the Wisconsin at 4 o'clock Friday afternoon bringing the news that a treaty of peace has been signed Friday afternoon by the revolutionary general, Herrera, and the government commissioners.

The principal points in the treaty of peace, which has now been signed by Minister of State Perdomo, specifies that Gen. Herrera shall hand over to the government the entire revolutionary fleet, consisting of the gunboats Padilla, Darien, Gaeten and Boyaca. All the war elements of the insurgent armies in the provinces of Cauca and Panama and the arms and ammunition captured at Agua Dulce are also to be surrendered.

Once peace has been declared, the Colombian congress will decide regarding the laws for the Panama canal and the elections, and also the paper money question, as this is the wish of the president and of the whole nation.

Panama, Nov. 24.—The Star and Herald says that at the conference on board the Wisconsin a distinguished son of Uncle Sam, Rr. Adm. Silas Casey, acted as a mediator and peacemaker, which conduct, it remarks, reflects great credit on a nation whose motives for doing good are too frequently disparaged.

Adm. Casey in a brilliant speech extended to the negotiators his heartfelt good wishes, highly praising them for their judgment and patriotism and their arrangement of such an extremely delicate matter. Gen. Cobas, chief minister of State Perdomo's staff, who spoke in good English, made an eloquent reply to this speech and in the name of Colombia thanked the gallant admiral for the hospitality and attention the negotiators had received on board his flagship and also for his generous intervention in the arrangement to bring about peace in that zone of Colombian territory.

Troops already are being sent away. Nearly one thousand men left Sunday night for Barranquilla. As soon as the revolutionary gunboat Padilla arrives here the troops in the Cauca province will be sent to Buena Ventura, on the bay of Choco.

Gen. Herrera and his secretaries have arrived at Agua Dulce, accompanied by a government commissioner bringing the news of the conclusion of peace to the gunboat Bogota in order to prevent a fight with the Padilla should they meet Gen. Salazar. The governor of Panama has set all political prisoners at liberty.

CHOLERA IS SPREADING.

Quarantine Increases the Suffering Among the Moro Towns.

Manila, Nov. 24.—The cholera is spreading among the Moro tribes on the west coast of Mindanao and there is much destitution among the people. Quarantine increases the suffering by stopping work and the movement of supplies. Gen. Davis has telegraphed to Gen. Sumner directing the distribution of food supplies to the sufferers in the infected and quarantined towns. The disease is disappearing from this city.

DYNAMITE OUTRAGE.

A Saloon in Mahanoy City, Pa., Wrecked Early Sunday Morning.

Mahanoy City, Pa., Nov. 24.—The most destructive dynamiting outrage that has occurred in the coal regions since the strike began was perpetrated here at 5 o'clock Sunday morning.

The dynamite with fuse attached was placed on the bar of the saloon of Christopher Portland. The front part of the building was blown across the street and the adjoining buildings on either side were badly wrecked. Windows were broken in every house in the square.

Portland and the other members of the family were sleeping on the third floor and escaped serious injury, although all were thrown from their beds. Portland's two sons are non-union men and worked during the strike.

A Break For Liberty.

Knoxville, Tenn., Nov. 24.—While one prisoner held the jailer six others escaped from jail at Dandridge, Tenn., late Sunday night. John Perry was the man who seized Jailer Fuller and in the struggle was unable to escape himself, although the others successfully got away. Lant Wright, one of the men who escaped, was in jail on the charge of housebreaking with intent to commit criminal assault. Officers with bloodhounds are scouring the country.

Boiling Asphalt Exploded.

Denver, Col., Nov. 24.—The entire plant of the Colorado Paving Co. was destroyed Sunday by a fire that originated from an explosion of boiling asphalt. The loss is estimated at \$50,000.

Queen Lil's Claim.

Chicago, Nov. 22.—Queen Lilionokani, of Hawaii, and her party passed through Chicago Friday on their way to Washington. Her claim for financial relief will again be urged during the coming winter before the national legislature.

Ten Thousand Were Killed.

San Francisco, Nov. 22.—A steamer arriving from Guatemala brought up a number of passengers who report that no fewer than 10,000 persons were killed by the eruption of the volcano San Maria.

GOLD NUGGETS OF NOTE.

One of the biggest nuggets was found in the Ural mountains, Russia, November 7, 1842, at a depth of nine feet. It weighed 96 pounds and was valued at \$22,345.

A lucky find was the "Heron nugget," turned up at Mount Alexander, Victoria, by a couple of young Englishmen who had been only three months in Australia. They returned to England immediately and sold it for \$20,400.

Not the most valuable, but one of the most beautiful in appearance, of Australian nuggets was the "Victorian," found in White Horse gully, Bendigo. It was purchased by the parliament of Victoria for \$8,250 and was presented to the late Queen Victoria.

There is a monster gold nugget lying at the bottom of the Atlantic. It was shipped from Santo Domingo to the king of Spain 400 years ago as a tangible proof of the value of Columbus' discovery, but was lost in a storm together with 30,000 ounces of smaller golden specimens.

One of the discoverers of the celebrated "Welcome nugget" died recently. The party that found it numbered 24. The splendid mass of gold was found at a depth of 180 feet under Bakery hill, Ballarat, Australia. Its original owners sold it in Ballarat for \$32,500 and its new possessors reaped a large harvest by exhibiting it in Melbourne and London before finally disposing of it to the bank of England. It was melted in London in 1859. There were very few foreign elements in it, the assay showing upward of 99 per cent. of pure gold.

HINTS TO HOUSEWIVES.

One-half cupful of sweet cream is added by certain New England housewives to the baked beans pot about a half-hour before it is taken from the oven.

A cheap, convenient and sanitary treatment of the ordinary wallpaper is to give it a wash of thin varnish. This improves and preserves the colors and makes any number of washings possible.

Oriental, who understand the niceties of eating from a hygienic standpoint much better than we of the occident, always take salt with their cheese. After one becomes addicted to the salt and apple habit they feel that apples should never be eaten in any other way.

Daintiness in serving is half the battle in making things appetizing. Salad served in tomato cups on a lettuce leaf, together with stuffed olives, is exceedingly attractive. So, too, cucumber cups are extremely nice in which to serve creamed fish garnished with a little parsley.

Steamed bacon is considered a far greater delicacy than boiled bacon and is a very much less wasteful way of cooking it. Take a piece of bacon, well wash and scrape it. Put it on a steamer over boiling water, put the steamer on the fire and cook till the bacon is tender. About 40 minutes should be allowed to each pound. When cooked peel off the thick outside skin and cover thickly with rasped breadcrumbs.
