



—Fat hogs are selling in Bourbon at \$4.15 per hundred.

—Two Mason county farmers have refused \$2.25 for seven hundred barrels of corn.

—Hogs are nearly all being killed for bacon by the farmers. The low price will fill the smoke-houses.

—Matt Turney, formerly of Paris, purchased the Chas. Thomas farm in Scott county, containing 196 acres, \$20,000.

—Mr. Wallace Estill sold his farm of ninety acres, in Fayette county, to James Price, of Scott county. The price was \$100 an acre.

—J. F. Tobin sold his farm near Stringtown, Nelson county, to John Riley for \$14,000. The farm contains 255 acres, well improved, and one of the most desirable homes in Nelson county.

—J. C. Adams, of Phoenix, Ariz., has sold to Wm. Simpson, of Cuba, N. Y., Lady Simpson, the dam of Sweet Marie, the trotting mare. Simpson recently bought McKinney, the sire of Sweet Marie, for \$50,000.

—That James R. Keene, proprietor of the Castleton Stud in Fayette county, is a believer in the English blood in breeding great thoroughbreds was evidenced at the great sales at Lexington, last week, when he bought three of the highest priced imported mares.
