Auctioneer A. T. Forsyth reports 500 people in attendance at Walter Clark's sale, notwithstanding the inclement weather. Bidding was lively and everything sold at good prices as follows: One pair of work mules, \$305; work horses, \$60 to \$90; cows, \$40 to \$62; shoats, \$4 to \$6; corn in crib, \$2.60 per barrel; oats, \$10.10 per ton; chickens, 40c to 50c each; turkeys, \$2 each; farm implements and goods sold well. The farm of 117 1/2 acres sold to W. A. Bacon, of Paris, for \$125 per acre.

Carlisle Gets Nice Fee.

A New York telegram says: "The decree of a lower court awarding John G. Carlisle, former Secretary of the Treasury \$25,349 for professional services in connection with a contest against the constitutionality of the laws under which duties were levied on goods imported from Porto Rico, has been affirmed by the Appellate division of the Supreme Court."
"Mr. Carlisle was engaged by Reon Barnes, who had been retained as counsel by various merchants, to assist him in the contest. As a result of the litigation the importers recovered nearly \$500,000 from the Government. According to Mr. Carlisle something over \$89,000 of this amount was paid over to Barnes, but the latter refused to make a settlement with him, denying that he had ever engaged Mr. Carlisle's services. Mr. Carlisle then brought suit to recover his fee and was awarded \$25,349."
