Mrs. Imogene Lyle, wife of J. Vi-mont Lyle, of New York, well known here, was arrested Monday, at Danville, by Chief-of-Police Wood and Sheriff McDowell and locked up on the charge of lunacy.

Mrs. Lyle was declared by her father, Mr. W. B. Holmes, some time ago, to be of unsound mind and figured in a sensational incident in Lexington resulting from her father's attempt to have her sent to an asylum. The case was later dropped and Mrs. Lyle went to Paris, France, returning to Danville about a month ago. Since her return she has been acting queerly and has been frightening the clerks in the various dry-goods stores where she did her shopping by making all sorts of threats against them.

Monday morning she entered the Boyle National Bank. Becoming angered at some fancied offense, she threatened to shoot Cashier Wallace, and made such a disturbance that the officers of the bank called in Chief-of-Police Wood and Sheriff McDowell. As soon as they appeared in the store Mrs. Lyle turned her anger against them and repeatedly threatened to kill them. It was only after a hard struggle, in which outside assistance was secured, that she was overpowered.

The affair created a great sensation in Danville. Her trial was still in progress yesterday morning behind closed doors.


