## CAUSE OF EXTRA SESSION.

After a strenuous day in both the Senate and the House the Revenue Bill was finally passed Tuesday at Frankfort with the retifier's clause out, leaving that feature covered by the act of 1904 which is now before the Court of Appeals for construction. This is the reason given by the Governor for calling the extra session.

## PULLED THROUGH.

Senate bills 100 and 101, the first of which creates a State Board of Agriculture and appropriating \$20,000 for farmers' institutes, and the second, of which establishes a State Fair, appropriating \$15,000, passed the House Tuesday night as did the Governor's pet bill of \$250,000 appropriation for the capitol, the foundation of which is not completed. This is an addition to the \$1,000,000 appropriation by the Legislature a year ago.

## TRANSFERRED TO LEE COUNTY.

After hearing evidence for two days on the State's motion for a change of venue in the Hargis-Callahan-French-Smith-Abner cases, Special Judge J. L. Dorsey ordered transfer of the case to Lee county. No day for calling the cases has yet been fixed.

The defendants were allowed bail in the sum of ten thousand dollars each.

They are charged with being accessories to the murder of James B. Marcum. Bond was given.


