PRIVATE LOCOMOTIVES
For High Officials of the Pennsylvania System.

The latest thing in "private" excellence is the locomotive. It is hereafter to be classed along with the private yacht and the private car. Three locomotives are being built at the Juniata shops of the Pennsylvania railroad for the personal use of President A. J. Cassett, General Manager W. W. Atterbury and General Superintendent George W. Creighton.
These engines are to be speedy, powerful and beautiful, and are to be reserved for special service only. For several years past the absence of brass work from locomotives has been noticeable. There will be a return of the brasswork vandy upon these locomotives. They will be beautifully modeled and all exposed parts will be highly polished. The interior of the cabs will be finished in mahogany, and the driving wheels will be covered with dust guards, patterned after the Deghlynn French engine.

NEWSBOYS WHO WON FAME.
Interesting Facts Ascertained by a New Yorker.

As illustrating the chance of success in America, Rudolph Heig, superintendent of the Newsboys' lodging house, New York city, took haphazard a list of 1,000 boys who used the lodging house some 20 years ago. Mr. Heig has traced their subsequent careers. One has been elected a governor of a state, one is governor of a territory, two are members of Congress, two sheriffs, two district attorneys, one is a city attorney, four are members of state legislatures, three county commissioners, one judge, 27 bankers, 22 merchants, one civil engineer, 460 clerks, 34 lawyers, 17 physicians, eight postmasters, three railroad officials in high office, 36 railroad men, ten estate agents, 15 journalists, 82 teachers, four high school principals, one superintendent, and 21 clergymen.


