The office occupied by Dr. Wasson's nephew, Dr. Julian C. Wasson, formerly of Paris, and now a prominent dentist at San Jose was badly damaged by the earthquake shock.

Higgins Extradicted.

Gov. Beckham honored a requisition of the Governor of Ohio for the extradition of Harry Higgins, alias I. Moore, a prisoner in the penitentiary, sent from this county, and wanted at Hamilton, O., on a charge of grand larceny. The Sheriff of Butler county, O., was at Frankfort to present the requisition papers at the gate of the prison on the release of the prisoner today, when his term expires. Higgins will be remembered as the young man who robbed the altar at the Catholic church of a number of valuables and was given a year in the pen. He was among a number of thieves who was following a circus at the time.
