FIRST MEETING

Of Knights Templar Held in Kentucky Was in 1847.

The convention for the organization of the Grand Commandery of Kentucky first assembled at Frankfort October 5, 1847, with William Brown as chairman. The meeting was successful, the organization being perfected with Henry Wingate as Grand Commander. The order has grown in membership, influence and power and now numbers 3,166 members, with 26 subordinate commanderies.

Since the last conclave, Winchester Commandery U. D., was organized October 6, 1905, and Somerset Commandery U. D. was organized March 15, 1906. Both of these commanderies received charters at the conclave last week.

The order of Knights Templar date back to ancient times. In the year A. D. 1118 nine gentlemen, among them Hugh de Payens and Godfrey de St. Aldemar, formed the order for the purpose of guarding and protecting pilgrims to the Holy Sepulcher. Baldwin I., King of Jerusalem, encouraged the organization and assigned them a part of the royal palace near the site of Solomon's Temple. Or as some state, a place of retreat in a Christian church supposed to have stood on the spot originally occupied by the Temple of Solomon.

From that they were called "Templars" and "Knights of the Temple." The history of the Templars is thrilling interesting and is a history of magnanimous warfare in defense of the Christian religion and protection of Christian pilgrims.

Forty-six States and territories of the United States of America have organized grand commanderies, with an aggregate membership of 150,440 in 1904. The total membership at the present time will approximately number 200,000.

VICTORIA FALLS

Is More Than Twice as High as Niagara—Wonder of Africa.

The Zambesie river, carrying a huge volume of water, two miles in width, as it reaches the western borders of Rhodesia, Africa, precipitates itself into a cavernous gorge, and thus traverses the northern plains of the country, writes Lieut. Col. Sir Percy Girouard in the May Scribner's. This great drop in the river has produced "the most beautiful gem of the earth's scenery," the Victoria falls. Almost twice as broad as Niagara, two and a half times as high, an immense mass of water rolls over its edge to precipitate itself in magnificent splendor 400 sheer feet into the narrow canyon below.

Undeterred, the Rhodesian engineers, have, without detracting from the natural beauty of the surroundings, thrown across the canyon a splendid 650 foot catilever bridge and thus opened the way to Tanganyika, to Uganda, to Cairo. This bridge, the greatest railway engineering triumph of Africa, deserves more than passing notice. It consists of a central span weighing approximately 1,000 tons, 500 feet in length and 30 feet wide. The steelwork is of rolled steel weighing 490 pounds to the cubic foot. The end posts of the bridge are over 100 feet long. The pull on the anchorage apparatus is about 400 tons.

The contract for the construction was obtained by an English firm of bridge builders—the contract time 55 weeks. The work of erection was carried on from both banks, the material being taken across the river by means of an aerial electric railway. The electrical conveyor of this cable way was capable of dealing with a ten-ton load with a lifting speed of 20 feet per minute and a traversing speed of 300 feet a minute.

An initial difficulty in the construction of the bridge was the securing of a firm foundation, and owing to the crumbling nature of the bank a much greater quantity of concrete was necessary than estimated. The construction was happily unattended by accidents of a serious nature, though a few slight accidents to bodywork and the replacing from England of one piece of steel work were recorded. In spite of these delays the bridge was linked up at 7 a. m., on April 1, 1905, or exactly 48 hours earlier than had been estimated a year before.
