George Eaton, who has served four years of a ten years' sentence in the Frankfort penitentiary, was given his liberty by Gov. Beckham Saturday.

Eaton was sent up from Whitley county for attempted criminal assault. He is well known to visitors at the prison during the past few years, having served in the capacity of assistant clerk to Prison Clerk Rowland and several of the latter's predecessors. Eaton was known as a convict to very few people as he was not required to wear the prison stripes and spent very little time inside the walls of the prison. He was not compelled to sleep in a cell, but occupied a bed in the hospital department because of his valuable services as assistant clerk. He will remain several weeks longer making up the report of the prison to be submitted to the Legislature. Eaton is an expert bookkeeper.

A Pretentious Negro.

The suit of Dr. J. E. Hunter, the most pretentious negro of Lexington, against the C. and O. Railroad Company for \$1,200 damages, was tried Saturday and resulted in a verdict for the defendant. The plaintiff alleged that on May 3 he was returning from Louisville on the C. and O. train and was in the car for colored people. As the train left Frankfort the conductor entered the car and began smoking. Dr. Hunter claimed that the smoke made him sick and from its effects he was very ill for six days. Judgment was asked for \$1,200 at the rate of \$200 a day for Dr. Hunter's illness. The jury was out only five minutes and returned a verdict for the defendant.
