The deceased was the wife of Col. Chas. H. Higbee, who was a Kentuckian, living within the bounds of the State until he moved to Fort Worth, Tex., 30 years ago.

Mrs. Higbee's last wish was that the Confederates keep watch over her and the last two nights they did, bringing their flags of the "Camp of Higbee Guards" with them. This camp was named in her honor. The Confederate guards carried the body to the station at Fort Worth and the sentiment expressed among them as the train bearing the remains was pulled out of Fort Worth, was "A Mother in Israel is gone."
