Fees for Special Attorneys.

Auditor F. P. James on Tuesday transmitted to the Senate a list of the amounts paid out by the State to special attorneys in fees during the past twelve years. This amount is \$179,912.57, an average of about \$15,000 a year. The Auditor has compiled the figures in this matter in pursuance to a resolution adopted by the Senate last week. Several bills are pending for providing further assistance to the Attorney General's department, and do away with special attorneys.
