### No Burley Grown for Two Years.

"The cutting out of the 1908 crop of tobacco means that there will be no Burley grown for two years," says President Clarence Lebus of the Burley Tobacco Association. "Even if there should be a crop in 1909 the leaf could not be marketed until 1910. Therefore, the 190,000,000 pounds of white Burley now in the pool must be the supply of the world for two years. Of course some little is grown in other States, but I speak of the belt in Kentucky which really supplies the markets of the world."

"Some months ago when we said 1906 Burley would sell for fifteen cents a pound, some people laughed. It is selling at that figure now, but we have not fixed a price for the 1907 leaf, and will not do so yet. Manufacturers of tobacco must have it, and they must pay for it."

"I have letters from three independent tobacco concerns now that want to buy their stock for two years. They know that we have won our fight. There is nothing more certain than that the Burley growers have won, and will free themselves from commercial bondage."

"The growers will lose nothing by cutting out the crop this year for they will sell their 1907 tobacco for three or four times as much as they are accustomed to receiving for one crop. Therefore they can afford not to plant."

### Big Back Tax Cases Dismissed.

At Winchester Monday, the big suit of M. P. Rehorn, State Auditor's Agent, against the Burley Tobacco Society, was tried before County Judge Evans and was dismissed, the Judge deciding that Mr. Rehorn had failed to make a case.

The suit was brought at Winchester as the headquarters of the Company and asked for back taxes on 1,000,000,000 pounds of tobacco valued at \$100,000,000.

Mr. Rehorn will either appeal the case or bring separate suits in each county of the district against the County Board of Control.



### The Black Hawk Corn Planter.



Does what others try to do—Drops the required number of grains in a hill regardless of the irregularity of the seed.

Allows changing of plates without removing seed from boxes. Drops the seed at the proper place whether team travels fast or slow. Has hand drop, check row, foot drop and drill can be changed from one to the other without the use of tools. Reels up the check row disc while planting last two rows.

Wheels can be set to run off or on the corn rows.

Be sure to examine this planter before you buy, otherwise you make a mistake.
