Probabilities of the Situation.

With Taft and Sherman named as the Republican standard-bearers, and Mr. Bryan as good as nominated by the Democrats, it is possible to figure out the probabilities of the situation.

There will be 483 votes in the electoral college, and the successful candidate must receive 242. Mr. Bryan may be given 158 to start with in States in which there will be practically no fight.

Only 131 can be figured as equally certain for Taft.

The safe Bryan States are: Alabama 11, Arkansas 9, Florida 5, Georgia 13, Kentucky 13, Louisiana 9, Mississippi 10, Missouri 18, North Carolina 12, Oklahoma 7, South Carolina 9, Tennessee 12, Texas 18, Virginia 12; Total 158.

The certain Taft States are: California 10, Connecticut 7, Idaho 3, Maine 6, Massachusetts 16, Michigan 11, Montana 3, Nevada 4, New Hampshire 4, North Dakota 4, Oregon 4, Pennsylvania 34, Rhode Island 4, South Dakota 4, Utah 3, Vermont 4, Washington 5, Wyoming 3; Total 131.

These States are doubtful and in all of them there will be a vigorous fight for the electoral vote: Colorado 5, Delaware 3, Illinois 27, Indiana 15, Iowa 13, Kansas 10, Maryland 8, Minnesota 11, Nebraska 8, New Jersey 12, New York 39, Ohio 23, Wisconsin 13, West Virginia 7; Total 194.

Giving Taft Ohio, West Virginia and Delaware, he will have 164, with New Jersey and New York added he will have 215, and he will still need 27 votes, and with all of these and Illinois he would have the exact number of necessary votes.

Mr. Bryan seems to have a good chance to carry Colorado, Nebraska and West Virginia, which would make his vote 181. With Indiana, Illinois and Wisconsin he will have 236, or seven short of the nomination. Iowa, or Minnesota, or Kansas would make him safe.

The campaign will begin with almost unparalleled uncertainty and a fight in a larger number of doubtful States than any previous campaign.

Johnson Will Cause Trouble.

Governor John Johnson, of Minnesota, will not permit the nomination of William Jennings Bryan by the Democratic party at its national convention in Denver on July 7, without a struggle. He threw down the gauntlet when, through his campaign manager, he announced:

"I will not accept the nomination for the Vice Presidency under any circumstances. If there is such a nomination I shall compel the national committee to make another choice." This situation means trouble for the Democrats at Denver. Although the Bryan following announce they have two-thirds of the delegates instructed for Bryan, the Johnson forces are far from quitting. They claim to have found a situation in the Democratic party today which is a black cloud on the Bryan horizon.

Kentucky Establishes a Precedent.

Kentucky has just established a precedent that will in time revolutionize race betting in America writes Robert Edgren. The State Racing Commission has refused to allow the bookmakers to resume business, and has declared in favor of the Pari-Mutuel system. This is the system used in France, and is as far ahead of ordinary bookmaking as the Mauretania is ahead of Robert Fulton's first steamboat.

Under the mutuel system the odds are mechanically regulated by the amounts wagered on the different horses in the race. If you win you get just what you are entitled to according to the natural odds. There is no rake-off to buy automobiles for the bookies.

In France the government percentage alone is taken off, and this is a small amount devoted to public charities. Heavy plunging under the mutuel system is an impossibility, for the reason that the plunger would create unnatural odds against himself.

It would be a great thing for racing if the mutuel system were adopted in New York, and when the anti-betting bill is repealed (as it surely will be in time) probably some provision for this reform will provide the foundation for the new law.

An Expensive Luxury.

Soldiers are expensive luxuries, and the State of Kentucky has spent approximately \$45,000 on the military, that portion of it which has been in active service, during the six months that Gov. Wilson has been in the executive chair. The figures were obtained from the records at the State House and are practically accurate. During the last two years of the administration of former Gov. J. C. W. Beckham, when soldiers were used in Breathitt county during the feud troubles, the total cost for soldiers on active duty was \$20,000.
