

**Suicide a Hard Job.**

"It is going to be a bigger job than I at first thought. I hope I make a success of it. I never did make a success of anything else."

After penning this concluding notation of a twelve-hour diary, which time he spent contemplating the act, Patrick Dooley, a resident of Fort Worth, Tex., swallowed a quantity of carbolic acid at a railway depot in that city early Friday dying before medical aid arrived. At 6 o'clock Thursday night Dooley wrote of having tried to think of some way to avoid suicide, but that he was ill and homeless. He referred in endeavoring terms to his mother and sister. A little later he complained because the only way he could find it possible to kill himself was by swallowing carbolic acid. At different times during the night he wrote of his despondency and warned young men of whisky and bad companions, concluding with the expression quoted.
