**Winsor Letton's Will Probated.**

The will of the late Winsor Letton  
was probated in the County Court Fri-  
day. The testator names his brother,  
Forest Letton, as executor; directs  
that no bond be required and that no  
accounting of the estate be made and  
further names his brother as guardian  
of his child or children.

After directing that his funeral ex-  
penses and just debts be paid that his  
executor sell, re-invest or dispose of  
the estate as in his judgment is for  
the best interests of its beneficiaries.  
He leaves to his wife Annie Letton, so  
long as she remains unmarried, the in-  
come from one-half of his estate, and  
the income from the remaining half to  
his child or children to be held in trust  
by said executor, and paid to them in  
such sums and such manner as he may  
direct.

In the event of his widow marrying  
her share is to revert to his brother in  
fee simple and the same rule applies  
to that part of his estate left to his  
child or children in the event of their  
death. The will is dated at Atlanta,  
Ga., Sept. 25, 1907, and is attested by  
three witnesses. The estate is valued  
at approximately \$6,000.



