Warning to Oyster Dealers.
For the information and guidance of the wholesale and retail dealers in oysters and others concerned:
Paragraph of Section 4 of the pure food law of the State of Kentucky as enacted by the General Assembly of 1908 deems an article of food adulterated:
"If any substance or substances be mixed or packed with it so as to reduce, lower or injuriously affect its quality or strength."
Under this paragraph of the law oyster dealers of this State are warned that the addition of ice or water to shucked oysters constitutes adulteration.
Jobbers and dealers receiving shucked oysters from packers should not accept them when ice or water has been added, and retailers are cautioned not to add ice to oysters nor to dilute them with water.

Hargis Painted Black.
Beach Hargis is now being tried for the murder of his father in the Circuit Court at Irvine, Ky., and a bitter fight for his liberty will be made if the opening statements of counsel count for anything. We clip the following from the report of the trial:
"Judge J. J. C. Bach, of Jackson, of counsel for Beach Hargis, began his opening statement for the defense. While he had been for years the legal adviser and friend of Judge Jim Hargis, Judge Bach scored the dead chief-tian in a much more bitter manner than was ever done by Byrd during all of his prosecution of Jim Hargis, and it was apparent from the smile on the lips of Byrd that he was at last being vindicated by one of the men who had for years defended Jim Hargis against his attacks.
"Judge Bach was bitter in his denunciation of the dead feudal chieftain and said that he was even more tyrannical than Louis XIV and more than any man of the Dark Ages.
"He said it would be shown that Beach Hargis was reared by his father not as a son but as a murdered; that he was taught everything that was bad and nothing that was good; that Mrs. Hargis was allowed no part in the bringing up of the son, and all in all the late feud leader was pictured by his friend as the worst creature the Mountains of Kentucky had ever known."



