### Old Millersburg Man Dead.

J. R. McCormick, 85 years old, a veteran of the Mexican and civil wars, died at the Confederate home at Higginville, Mo., last Tuesday, as the result of a fist blow by Jim Cummings. Cummings was a follower of the noted train and bank robbers, the James and Younger boys in the days of their maraudings. In a fight Cummings struck the blow that caused McCormick's death. A coroner's jury returned a verdict that McCormick came to his death from a blow delivered by Cummings, but as McCormick was the aggressor, Cummings was held blameless.  
 McCormick was formerly of Millersburg, this county, leaving there for Missouri about 35 years ago. He was with Morgan in all of his raids and was considered one of his bravest and most daring men. He will be remembered by the old-timers at Millersburg.

### Meeting of Bourbon Fair Directors.

The Directors of the Bourbon County Agricultural Society held at meeting at the court house Friday with President Jos. M. Hall in the chair.  
 The Board decided to offer a special premium of \$200 for a class ring on horses to be determined by the catalogue committee. In addition to this the farmers of Bourbon county are going to offer a special premium of \$250 for the best saddle stallion, mare or gelding.  
 These specials, together with the specials by individuals and firms and the regular premium offered by the Association will probably aggregate \$5,000. We predict that the Bourbon County Fair for 1909 will eclipse any held in the history of the old Association.

President Hall appointed a special committee, consisting of J. T. Hinton, George Rassenfoss, R. J. Neely and F. P. Lowry, to make arrangements with the city authorities and the Blue Grass Traction Company for the completion of side tracks necessary for the handling of the company's cars during the week of the fair, and for the furnishing by the latter of a free night current for lighting the grounds during the exhibitions of the carnival company.

The fair grounds were tendered the horsemen of Bourbon county for the annual stallion show which will take place Monday, April 5. The Committee on Music reported the engagement of Weber's band, of Cincinnati, which will furnish music during the week of the fair.


