### Hot Time in England.

Thousands of workmen from all parts of the metropolis, carrying banners and singing political songs, were present. ### Growers Hold Meetings.

About 400 Burley tobacco growers, in convention at Georgetown Saturday afternoon, adopted resolutions declaring respect for the Judge in the Clark Circuit Court, but also confidence in President Lebus. They ask that all dues for outages, commissions, etc., be returned to the Burley offices but that all those dissatisfied shall receive their share of same from 1906 and 1907 crops. Another resolution repudiated any desire that Gaitskill and others shall enter any plea or represent them in any way. The resolutions were signed by R. B. Thomas, chairman, and Charles Hall, Secretary. Similar resolutions have been adopted at meetings held in Harrison and other counties in Central Kentucky.

### Deficit in the State Treasury.

With the revenues from taxes beginning to come into the State Treasury in sufficient volume to cut appreciable figure, the State faces a deficit in its bank balance of \$601,250 51. Much of this will be wiped out before the first of January, when the session of the general assembly will be ushered in, but not enough to leave any wide margin for extravagant appropriations. The books of the State Treasurer show that at the close of business November 30, there was in the State treasury the sum of \$338,872.37, divided into the following funds: Sinking fund, \$167,670.86; school fund, \$345,709.93; deficit in general expenditure fund \$176,507.42. There were outstanding warrants on that date, however, amounting to almost a million dollars, or to be exact, \$938,131.880 which makes the deficit above given.

### Reform School Making Money.

Gus Richardson, who has charge of the farm on which the Kentucky School of Reform is located, near Lexington, was in Louisville Saturday night enroute to his home in Meade county. Mr. Richardson has been superintendent of the farm for two years, and according to his last report to the prison commission he is making things hum. Mr. Richardson's report shows he netted from the 200 acres owned by the State and 100 acres rented \$10,431.90 for the fiscal year ending October 31. His labor used in operating the farm is from the inmates of the institution. There are now 700 inmates.

"The year before I took charge of the farm," said Mr. Richardson, "the profits were only \$700. The first year I was there the income was about \$5,000 and the past year I raised it to over \$10,000. I believe that I can do better still from now on."

Mr. Richardson formerly represented Meade county in the Legislature and he also served a term in the Senate.

### Will Comply With Ruling.

Judge D. L. Pendleton, of Winchester, and Col. T. L. Edelen, of Frankfort, attorneys for the Burley society, held conferences with the Burley Society officials at Lexington, Tuesday, relative to amending the articles of incorporation of the Burley Tobacco and Insurance Company, so that they will conform to the ruling of the Attorney-General on the insurance clause.

The Burley Company officials will make no objection to conforming to the opinion of the Attorney-General, but will file the new articles of incorporation in accordance with the Attorney-General's opinion as soon as they can be prepared.
