### Government vs. Burley Society.

The Government is preparing to begin proceedings against the Burley Tobacco Society, says a special from Washington City, viz:

Convinced that the society is a combination and a conspiracy under the terms of the Sherman anti trust law, the Department of Justice is investigating the society's operations on that ground. Agents recently sent to the tobacco regions for the purpose of making inquiry concerning the methods of the association have reached some rather sensational conclusions.

The officials in charge of the inquiry have reached the conclusion that the organization comes within the inhibitions of the Sherman law and there is now a well designed purpose to present the matter to the courts. The department, however, is undecided as to whether the proceeding shall be civil or criminal.

The Burley Society is a strong organization composed largely of farmers, and it is believed that the Government's action when taken will create a sensation. It is contended by members of the society that they have been forced to band themselves together to resist the operations of the American Tobacco Company. The company, the members of the society charge, systematically depressed the market for Kentucky and Tennessee tobacco and kept prices down to the lowest point.

Further justification for the creation of the society to set forth in the statement that the so-called tobacco trust has driven down its prices on raw tobacco while making no reductions in the finished products sold by it and manufactured from the Kentucky and Tennessee leaf.

### Bradley is Still Game.

John R. Bradley, the New York millionaire who backed Dr. Cook in his polar expedition, confirmed the story that he contemplated another expedition to the Arctic regions. He expects to leave in July, and his present purpose is to accompany it. He can give no details until he hears further from Captain Svedrup. Mr. Bradley says that the expedition is to have nothing to do with any of the Cook explorations and that it is to be only one of the private enterprises which he has sent out, not only into the polar regions, but into Asia and Africa.

### A Bond Issue.

When the Republicans took charge of affairs in Kentucky the State Treasury had nearly a million dollars in it. This has been spent and the State is now nearly a million dollars in debt. The State officials are thinking of the next campaign and wondering how they can go before the people with that big debt facing them, and have decided to ask the Legislature to issue State bonds to the extent of a million dollars. As the Legislature is Democratic and that party is averse to bond issues, it is not believed it will be done.

### A New Animal Discovered.

A new animal has been discovered in British East Africa by the Smithsonian African scientific expedition, who under the leadership of Colonel Roosevelt, have been in that region securing specimens of fauna and flora for the National Museum at Washington City.

The new animal, the first announcement of whose discovery was made at the Smithsonian institution Monday, is a hitherto unknown species of Octocyon, to which officials of the scientific organization have given the specific name of vergatus. It is a small carnivorous animal closely resembling a fox.

"Octocyon Rooseveltus" is the cognomen for the new animal, which was discovered here today, would make an appropriate designation. But the Smithsonian officials, perhaps fearing the discoverer would object, decided to make its specific name vergatus, meaning striped.

### Polar Data Coming.

Dr. Cook's polar data is on the way to Washington to be examined by the National Geographical Society. According to information sent there, the documents were started from Copenhagen December 21, which will get them to Washington about the end of the present week.

### Cook Not Broke.

Dr. F. A. Cook has never made use of the \$15,000 letter of credit he obtained from the Carnegie Trust Company just before he disappeared about a month ago, according to a statement made by R. B. Morehead, secretary of the banking institution.

The explorer also has a large cash credit with the company which cannot be withdrawn before February 1, as it is a time deposit. At the time of his sudden departure he withdrew all the money to his credit in his checking account.

### Gives Away \$6,000,000.

Thomas Waggoner, one of the few remaining cattle kings of Texas, Saturday made royal gifts to each of his three children when deeds of conveyance were signed by him at his New Year dinner table.

Each child is given 100,000 acres of land, 3,000 head of beef cattle and 1,000 horses. The total value of the property involved is \$6,000,000.

Waggoner, who has been identified with Ft. Worth's growth for a third of a century, is only 57 years old, but has decided to relinquish some of his cares.

Despite his generous gifts he has enough to live on comfortably for a long time yet, thank you!

### General Assembly Organize.

Both branches of the General Assembly were organized at Frankfort Wednesday shortly after the noon hour. In the House the oath of office to the members was administered by Judge W. E. Sattie, of the Court of Appeals. The oath in the Senate was administered by Circuit Judge Sandidge, of Russellville. Each branch of the General Assembly then proceeded with the election of officers. The officers for both the House and the Senate are the same as those chosen by the Democratic caucuses of the House and Senate Tuesday afternoon and night respectively.
