### Moonshining in Chicago.

It has developed in the last week that Chicago is the center of a moonshining industry of large proportions, says the Courier-Journal. Not the sort of moonshining that is known in the mountains of Kentucky and in the hills and hollows of the South, for the moonshiners in Chicago deal with a less deadly product. They operate in basements and stables, as difficult of access to revenue officials as some of the illicit stills in mountain fastnesses, and they devote their carefully concealed energies to transforming oleomargarine into butter.

Of course oleomargarine is not butter and it cannot be made into butter. So far as appearances go, however, it is a good imitation when colored and doctored and labeled. It has been the business of the Chicago moonshiners to look after these necessary details and they have done their work well—from a moonshining standpoint. It is estimated that the people of Chicago are consuming 50,000 pounds of oleomargarine a day under the mistaken impression that it is a creamery product of fair to middling quality.

The Federal Government imposes a tax of 10 cents a pound for coloring oleomargarine. It is a violation of law to evade this payment and also to sell "renovated" or "process" butter without so marking it that the purchaser may understand what he is buying. The Chicago moonshiners have violated the statutes in these particulars and, in addition are said to have made fraudulent use of inspection labels. The revenue officials figure that in five years the Federal Government has been cheated out of as much as \$5,475,000 as a result of the evasion of that tax.

There is to be a sweeping grand jury investigation of the whole matter. As usual in such cases there is a goodly amount of talk about "men higher up." There is no question that the moonshiners have bought their supplies from manufacturers of high standing in the business world and these manufacturers and their representatives are to be the subjects of the grand jury investigation. One of the concerns to be investigated is that of William J. Mexley, the "stand-pat" Republican who was elected to succeed William Lorimer, now Senator, in the lower house of Congress. Other men of less prominence will find it necessary to show "a clean bill of health."

From a mere local scandal, it appears, the Chicago moonshining case may bring developments which will make it of nation-wide interest.



As the result of a dispute arising over the sale of a hall by Alvey Ellis to Allen Ellis, near Danville, the two men engaged in a fierce pistol duel. Two bullets went through Ellis' body and he will die. The young men are cousins and resided on adjoining farms.

**Inspector Can be Punished.**  
The Court of Appeals Wednesday held that an inspector of election is liable for prosecution under the prohibitory statute aimed against election officers who shall mutilate, deface or spoil ballots after they have been voted so as to vitiate them. The court considered a judgment of the Kenton Circuit Court in the case of the Commonwealth against Wm. Goulet, an inspector who was indicted for spoiling a Democratic ballot in the recent Circuit Judge's race by stamping a cross also under the Republican emblem. The lower court dismissed him on peremptory instructions on the ground that an inspector is not an election officer and cannot be punished under the statute.
