## Cincinnati Boosters' Train.

A special train of ten cars will leave Cincinnati Monday, April 22, at 7:40 a. m. with 125 boosters aboard. This will comprise members or representatives of some of the largest firms of the Queen City.

The first day will be spent between Cincinnati and Lexington, with a side trip to Frankfort, where Gov. J. B. McCreary and other State officials will welcome the enthusiastic citizens of Cincinnati. The second day at High Bridge and Harrison, the third day at Chattanooga. The fourth day between Chattanooga and Middlesboro and the fifth day on to Cincinnati making stops along the line.

The Boosters' Special will reach Paris about 5:20 p. m. on April 26 for a short stop to meet the citizens of our town.

The excursions conducted by the Commercial Association are proving most valuable to all classes of business bringing a closer and wider extension business connections throughout the South and opening up a more enthusiastic friendly feeling and firm business connection between the larger and smaller cities and producing results which are proving to be of a lasting nature.

The train will be equipped in the best manner known to railroad management, and will consist of 5 standard Pullman sleepers; 1 tourist sleeper, 2 baggage cars, 1 commissary car and 2 dining cars.

Accompanying the party will be Weber's Band of twenty men, a complete motion picture outfit and a stereopticon equipment to show in the different towns the boosters will visit the great improvement being made in Cincinnati and the South.
