EGYPTIAN BARON is a black horse 15.2. A grand individual and one of the best representatives of the great Baron Wilkes. He is one of the fastest, best headed horses in Kentucky, and has been a mile over my three-quarter track, which is at least three seconds slower than Lexington, in 2:09 1/4, last half in 1:03 1/4, last quarter in :30 1/4. Although he is a pacer, he was a natural and fast trotter and could trot in 2:40 at two years old. Was raced a little for education, and proved himself a game level headed race horse, and if he stays right, we predict a record of 2:05 or better this year. He has served a few mares, and his colts are good individuals and fast. One, a yearling, out of a pacing mare, is one of the best trotters, for his work, I ever had-trotted a mile, with few days work, last fall, in 2:58 1/4, last half in 1:26, last quarter in :42.
