How "Dissolution" Helps.

The Standard Oil Co.'s profit figures for the six months since January first—the first six months of operation under the terms of the Supreme Court's dissolution decrees—show that the trust has piled up profits of \$46,611,628. Last year the Standard Oil Company of New Jersey, the corporation which distributed dividends for the trust, paid out profits of \$3,335,320.

Thus it is apparent that "dissolution" suits are highly beneficial to such law-defying monopolies as the Standard Oil Co.

Wilson's Broad Appeal.

The practical wisdom of Governor Wilson's nomination is asserting itself more every day. Of all the men that were available for the Democratic nomination, none was so well fortified as the New Jersey Governor to meet the requirements of the country and the party.

That he has the confidence of the business interests is shown by the fact that his nomination did not cause the slightest disturbance in the financial centers that are supposed to be barometers of the business welfare.

All the big corporations are working almost to the limit of their capacity. The Baldwin Locomotive Works, of Philadelphia, which employs 15,000 men in one plant, announced within the week that it would work to the capacity for a year to come on present orders.

Every day sees the conversion of influential Republicans to the Governor's allegiance, notable among whom is C. R. Crane, the Chicago millionaire who long supported Roosevelt.

Added to these favorable signs the government crop reports point to a bumper yield, so that it would seem that even Providence approved the selection of the noted Princeton man to lead the Democratic hosts to victory.

Favors Democrat as Leader.

William H. Hotchkiss, chairman of the National Progressive party in New York State, has announced that he favored the nomination of a progressive Democrat to lead the Progressive ticket in New York this fall. This announcement caused excitement among the Republican followers of Theodore Roosevelt.

William Barnes, Jr., chairman of the Republican State Committee, stated Friday afternoon that the regular Republican party would not attempt by any technicalities of the election law to hamper the election of Progressive electors in this State. The electors are State officers, and there is no way to keep them off the State ticket.

Sees Success Ahead.

Governor James B. McCreary has returned to Frankfort from Atlantic City after the Baltimore convention. Governor McCreary is very sanguine over the prospects of the Democratic candidates this fall and expresses the opinion that Wilson and Marshall will come out the winners in the coming election. In discussing the matter Governor McCreary said:

"Kentucky sent me to Baltimore instructed to cast her twenty-six votes for Champ Clark and, as chairman of the delegation, I personally cast those twenty-six votes as a unit for forty-five ballots. It was not only a duty, but a pleasure, to have done so, for Mr. Clark was my choice. When Governor Stone, Mr. Clark's manager, released his friends, our delegation went to Governor Wilson and materially aided in giving him the two-thirds majority necessary to secure his nomination. I believe that Governor Wilson and Governor Marshall will lead the Democracy to a great victory in November. I have nothing but praise for the ticket and the commendation for the platform, which is the most progressive ever adopted in a national convention. During Governor Wilson's several visits to Kentucky I had the pleasure of meeting him and hearing his addresses both at Lexington and at Frankfort. Recently at Atlantic City I had the opportunity to renew that acquaintance. He impresses every one that meets him as a resolute, virile, able man with the intellect to solve the great problems of government and the courage to give force and effect to his advanced ideas.

"I talked with many of the leaders at Baltimore, and the consensus of opinion was that under Wilson and Marshall a united party will march against the broken ranks of the Republicans. The Eastern Democrats have taken most kindly to Governor Wilson's nomination. There is positive enthusiasm for him in New York and New Jersey, where his labors as president of Princeton and his more recent constructive work as Governor of New Jersey have won the favor of that large independent element which supported Grover Cleveland.

"It is my opinion that Kentucky will give Wilson and Marshall the greatest majority ever returned for a presidential ticket in this State. I shall speak for Wilson and Marshall and do all in my power to elect them."
