STOCK, CROP AND FARM NOTES.

—Prof. J. M. Scott, of Jacksonville, sold a crop of tobacco last week at 15 cents a pound.

—Smith & Turney, of Harrison county, were in Bourbon last week buying mules. They purchased of Frank Burton 6 head of yearling mules at \$90 per head.

—Farmers of Nicholas county, who have plenty of feed are wintering their stock. There is a demand for stock but very little is changing hands. Prices are high.

—Letton Vimont, of near Millersburg, sold and delivered to John Leer at Millersburg 3,860 pounds of tobacco. The price paid was 20 cents per pound. The crop was grown on 2 1/4 acres of ground.

—E. F. Spears & Sons, of Paris, last week purchased and had delivered to their warehouse in this city a carload of hemp seed. The seed was purchased from S. M. Gibson, of Jessamine county, at \$2.50 per bushel.

—Abe Renick, of Clark county, formerly of Bourbon, has sold one of his pure short-horn steers at the fancy price of 21 cents a pound. The steer will go to the Iowa Agricultural Experiment Station to be entered in field test.

—Thos. McClintock, of Millersburg, sold to a Cincinnati party last week 16 mules for \$2,850, and one to Hord Armstrong for \$100. Mr. McClintock bought in Bath county last week fourteen mules at from \$125 to \$200. Mr. McClintock has about 25 mules on hand at his barns in Millersburg.
