STOCK AND FARM NOTES

—A dispatch from Lancaster says: "Messrs. Richard Scudder, Matt Cohen and James L. Gay have sold their saddle two-year-old, Imperator Rex, bought by them last year when but a yearling from Mrs. R. T. Lowndes, Jr., for \$1,500, to an Eastern buyer for \$3,000."

—Total receipts of live stock on the Chicago market ending Feb. 7, in round numbers, were 41,500 cattle, 170,300 hogs, and 88,900 sheep. Total receipts of live stock on the Chicago market compared with the previous week, in round numbers, decreased 32,200 hogs, decreased 7,700 cattle and increased 18,200 sheep. Compared with the corresponding period of a year ago cattle decreased 2,400, hogs increased 20,800, and sheep decreased 4,300.

ASKS HEAVY DAMAGES

Because She Was Induced to Leave Her Husband.

Allegations that William H. Barnard induced her to leave her husband, William W. Wood, of Philadelphia, by promise to secure a divorce and marry her, if her husband divorced her, and by promise to pay her \$20,000 in cash and \$100 a week for the rest of her life, are made by Mrs. Gertrude A. Wood, of Philadelphia, in a suit for \$25,000 damages which she filed in New York a few days ago against Barnard.

Mrs. Wood alleges that her husband obtained a divorce decree but that Barnard failed to fulfill his alleged agreement.

Mrs. Wood swears that she repulsed Barnard's alleged advances at first, and told him to never again enter her home, but that he renewed his attention and told her that her husband was too friendly with other women, although Mrs. Wood avers, she knew this to be false. She says Barnard induced her to leave her husband and come to New York.

Wood then began a suit for divorce. Mrs. Wood says she told Barnard that she intended to testify that she was blameless in so far as her forced relations with him were concerned. She asserts that Barnard told her he could not testify in her behalf, as his wife and daughter were with him.

Then, Mrs. Wood avers, Barnard made her the financial offer and, believing her unsupported defense would be useless, she did not defend the divorce suit, and Wood won the decree.
