## EARLY WAR BULLETINS FROM EUROPE.

#### FORTY THOUSAND BELGIANS KILLED.

LONDON, Aug. 25.—The Ostead correspondent of the Chronicle says that Belgium's losses so far are estimated at 40,000 killed. No estimate of the appalling property loss has been hazarded by the officials.

Industry everywhere is at a standstill, says the correspondent.

Not a single factory or coal pit in the country has been operated in three weeks and not a single penny in wages has been received by the men engaged in the staple activities of the nation since August 1.

There is nothing but dire poverty, distress and stagnation even in the areas untouched by the fighting.

NAMUR FALLS BEFORE GERMANS

Namur, the Belgian fortress, has fallen into German hands, according to an announcement made by the official press bureau in London. Details of the fighting around the fortress were not given, but the English newspapers regard the fall as inexplicable.

#### ZEPPELIN AIRSHIP BROUGHT DOWN.

LONDON, Aug. 25.—The correspondent at Antwerp of the Evening News telegraphs that a Zeppelin airship which flew over Antwerp last night was brought down by Belgian artillery fire six miles outside Antwerp. The crew of fifteen men were taken prisoners.

Another dispatch from Antwerp says this Zeppelin before it was brought to earth succeeded in dropping seven or eight bombs into Antwerp. One of the houses wrecked by these missiles was situated about 300 yards from the Palace of King Albert.

Seven persons were killed and six seriously injured by this explosion. Some other houses were half demolished by the falling bombs. The bombs exploded with terrific force and threw the inhabitants of Antwerp into a state bordering panic.

#### GERMANS ON DEFENSIVE AT TSIN-TAU.

TSIN-TAU, China, Aug. 25.—The cipher message from Emperor William, addressed to the Tsin-Tau garrison, in which they were called upon to defend the position to the uttermost, was read aloud at roll-call Friday evening. It was received stoically.

The Germans have dynamited all the tall structures here which might be of any assistance to an attacking fleet in giving them sighting points. They have also destroyed the railroad bridge at the boundary of their leased territory and they have razed the Chinese villages within the territory. The inhabitants of these villages have been partially compensated.

The blockade of Tsin-Tau by British, French and Russian vessels of war began early Monday.

Up to the present time only British regiments have received orders to cooperate with the Japanese in the operations against Kiao-Chau on the seaside. The French, however, are expecting orders to assist the British. There probably will not be more than two or three regiments from each nation.

"The French and English, their plan of attack having failed owing to unforeseen difficulties, have retired on the covering positions."

Dutch army experts interpret this dispatch as an admission of a crushing defeat for the allies and they believe that another admission made earlier in the day of "serious losses on both sides" means that the slaughter on the battle fields in engagements covering nearly a week have been appalling.
