Bourbon Tax Values Increase Nearly \$2,000,000

County Clerk Pearce Paton Friday finished his work of recapitulation of the Bourbon County tax lists, and the totals show that the taxpayers in Bourbon County have increased the valuation on their property over last year by \$1,629,965. This year the tax lists show a total valuation of all lands, town lots and personal property of \$18,690,728 divided as follows: Value of farm land, \$11,407,058; town lots, \$3,058,201, and personal property valued at \$4,225,469. Last year the total valuation of all taxable property in Bourbon County was \$17,060,763. Below is given a table in detail of the assessments:

Mr. Landrum for eight years had been editor of the Danville Messenger, and prior to that time was for a number of years publisher and editor of the Lancaster Record. He was a former president of the Kentucky Press Association. Mr. Landrum was forty-seven years old and was a son of General W. J. Landrum. He was a very capable newspaper man, and was one of the brightest paragraphers on the Kentucky press. He was a genial, generous, loyal and lovable man, one who will be greatly missed. He is survived by a devoted wife, who has the deep sympathy of the editors of the State in her bereavement.

CIGARETTE SMOKING ON INCREASE IN FRANCE.

France is smoking cigarettes in record number. "War nerves" have brought about tremendous increase in the country's tobacco consumption—in fact, an increase of 50 per cent since 1913, when 1,500,000 kilos of tobacco went up in smoke. There has been a 30 per cent increase in cigarette smoking, the total used in 1916 being 463,000,000 during the pre-war year.

As a result the French government has reserved for troops at the front vast quantities of tobacco and cigarettes, diminishing the supply for civilians. The period has fixed allotments to each city.
