KENTUCKY ELECTORS CAST VOTES FOR COX

Kentucky's thirteen electoral votes were cast Tuesday for James M. Cox for President, and Franklin D. Roosevelt for Vice-President. Miss Sarah Agnes Hayes, Madisonville, first woman to hold the honor, was elected messenger to carry the returns to the President of the Senate.

The electors met in the Senate chamber, in Frankfort. Frank Stowers, Pineville, could not be present, and Frank Kavanaugh, former State Librarian, was chosen to act for him. They were sworn in by Rollin Hurt, Judge of the Court of Appeals and elected Dr. A. J. A. Alexander, Woodford county, for the State-at-Large, chairman, and Senator Robert H. Scott, Paducah, secretary.

A secret ballot was taken separately for President and Vice-President, after which Miss Hayes was elected, and the returns officially compiled in triplicate. Miss Hayes will carry one, another will be mailed to the President of the Senate and the third will be filed at Frankfort in the United States District Court.
