MANUFACTURES IN CITIES OF KENTUCKY.

The Department of Commerce, through the Bureau of the Census, reports the general results of the 1920 census of manufacturers, covering the year 1919, for the cities of Kentucky.

The census of manufactures, 1919, like that of 1914, exclude the hand trades, the building trades, and the neighboring industries, and took account only of establishments conducted under the so-called factory system.

The reports were taken for the calendar year ending December 31, 1919, or the business year of the establishment most nearly conforming to that calendar year.

The census inquiry calls for the amount of capital, both owned and borrowed, invested in the business, but excludes the value of rented property.

In addition to the component materials which enter into the value of products, the cost of materials in this summary includes the cost of fuel, mill supplies, and rent of power and heat.

The value of products represents their selling value or price at the plants as actually turned out by the factories during the census year, whether sold or on hand.

THE NURSES' UNION

Can the rules and regulations of the labor union be applied to the services of a trained nurse in a manner which squares with the duties of her profession?

This is the question which seems to be raised by the revolt of Dr. Chas. H. Mayo, head of the famous Mayo clinic at Rochester, Minnesota.

Dr. Mayo is calling for 100,000 sub-nurses to relieve "the acute shortage." He maintains that the leaders of the new nurses' union have carried their methods too far and with too high a hand, and in doing this have defeated their own purpose.

It is his contention that ministrations to the dying cannot be bound by hard and fast rules, and in the formulation of rules governing the nurses' union the leaders ought to take the obligation of the nurses to the services of humanity into consideration.

There can be no objection to the nurses' organization, but commercialization is a thing that ought to be avoided.

Think of a nurses' strike at a hospital. We might as well imagine the doctors going on strike, for the nurse is the right hand of the doctor. It may be argued that the doctors themselves are organized, but if they are it is under regulations which throw no restrictions around their hours of service.

If the nurses' union will amend its rules along the same lines there can be no objection to it.
