Notice is hereby given that pursuant to the request of the Board of Education of the City of Paris, Kentucky, the Board of Council of the City of Paris, Kentucky, by resolution passed at the regular meeting of said Council on the 8th day of November, 1922, and approved by the Mayor, called and ordered an election to be held on the 16th day of December, 1922, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of the City of Paris, Kentucky, the proposition whether or not, bonds shall be issued in the amount of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) and taxes levied from year to year to pay the said bonds and interest thereon, the proceeds of the same to be used for the purpose of constructing and equipping an addition to the school building for white children in the City of Paris, Kentucky. The amount of the indebtedness proposed to be thus incurred is Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) and the purpose of the same is to construct and equip an addition to the school buildings for white children in the City of Paris, Kentucky, and the amount of money necessary to be raised annually by taxation for an interest and sinking fund to meet said indebtedness of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00), or such portion thereof as may be required for said purpose. By said resolution, a special registration for those persons entitled to vote at said election, whose names have not been recorded on the registration books, was likewise called and ordered to be held on the 9th day of December, 1922. RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the City of Paris, Kentucky, have submitted to the Board of Council of the City of Paris, Kentucky, a written report setting forth the needs of said school, and WHEREAS, it appears from said report that the necessities of said school require that an addition to the school buildings for white children, be constructed and equipped, and it further appearing from said report that the sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) will be required for said purpose and it appearing that said sum cannot be raised by a levy of a tax allowed by law in any one year and that the said sum necessary to be expended for said purposes exceeds the income and revenue of the City of Paris, Kentucky, for school purposes in any one year, and WHEREAS, it further appears that the only practicable method of raising said sum of money is by the issue of bonds and a levy from time to time to pay the bonds and interest thereon, and WHEREAS, said Board of Education in said report, recommended and requested that the proposition of issuing the bonds in the amount of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) be submitted to a vote of the qualified voters of the City of Paris, Kentucky, and WHEREAS, said Board of Education have filed suit in the Bourbon Circuit Court against the Mayor and the Board of Council of the City of Paris, Kentucky, asking the said Court to require the Board of Council to adopt an ordinance, submitting said question to the qualified voters of the City of Paris, Kentucky. THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of Council of the City of Paris, Kentucky, that an election be and the same is hereby called and ordered to be held on the 16th day of December, 1922, and that at said election there be submitted to the qualified voters of the City of Paris, Kentucky the following proposition: "Are you in favor of issuing bonds in the sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00), to be paid by levies from time to time to meet the bonds, and interest thereon for the purpose of constructing and equipping an additional building for said school for white children?" There is likewise called and ordered to be held a Special Registration on the 9th day of December, 1922, for the purpose of registering all qualified electors who are not already properly registered. For the purpose of holding said election and registration, it is ordered that the Sheriff of Bourbon county on the dates aforesaid, cause the polls to be opened in each of the twelve voting precincts in the City of Paris, Kentucky, on the dates aforesaid and as the law directs. It is further ordered that said bonds, if authorized to be issued, shall mature at intervals to be hereafter determined, but none of said bonds are to mature at a later date than 25 years after the date of issue and that there shall be raised annually by taxation for said purpose, the sum of Five Thousand Dollars, or such part thereof as may be necessary for an interest and sinking fund for the purpose of paying the interest on said bonds and redeeming said bonds at their maturity. Said bonds shall be issued providing for the payment of interest thereon at the rate of not more than Five Per Cent (5%) per annum. At the election herein ordered, the qualified voters of the City of Paris, Kentucky, shall have the right to vote and the tax proposed to be levied for the purposes aforesaid, shall be levied upon all property in the City of Paris, Kentucky, subject to levy for school purposes in the City of Paris, Kentucky. The City Clerk shall give notice of the election and registration above provided for, by publishing a notice thereof in a newspaper having a general circulation in the City of Paris, Kentucky, for at least once a week for three consecutive weeks prior to the date of said election and registration. Said notice shall specify the amount of indebtedness proposed to be incurred, the purpose of the same and the amount necessary to be raised annually by taxation for an interest and sinking fund as above stated. The City Clerk will furnish the Sheriff of Bourbon county a certified copy of this resolution and will likewise furnish a copy of the same to the County Clerk of Bourbon county within ten days after the passage of the resolution, and the said Sheriff and the said County Clerk are directed to do and to perform each and everything required under the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, in conducting said election and registration and in the preservation of the returns and canvassing and certification of the vote. It is further ordered and directed that the Board of Election Commissioners of Bourbon county shall canvass the returns of said election and certify the result and they are directed to deliver a copy of the certification each to the Board of Council of the City of Paris, Kentucky, and to the Board of Education of the City of Paris, Kentucky.
