THE MURDER CASE.

Court convened at 1 o'clock Monday, with Judge Hanson presiding, for trial of the case of the Commonwealth vs. James P. Mills, accused of the murder of Peter Dugan.

A murder trial is somewhat of a novelty here, as we have not had an exciting one since that of W. H. White for the murder of Patrick Egan in March of 1881, though the case, was Thomas Lee, the Evans City case, was tried in Dec. of 1891, and hence this one attracted a large number of spectators.
