CREAMERY PATRONS.

Milk is to be delivered four times a week in winter and daily in summer except Sunday. On the route to the creamery the cans must be protected from heat in summer and freezing in winter by covering with clean blankets.

Patrons should be especially careful about milk delivery. Almost any hay or fodder that has been stored in a barn should never be allowed under any circumstances.

Warm milk should not be put in the can with the previous milking that has been stored in the barn.

When the milk is not delivered every day, it should be stirred up at least once in 12 hours to prevent the cream from rising.

Milk should be delivered promptly at the same hour for each patron.

As soon as the cans come home with skim milk they should be emptied, rinsed with water, and washed with warm water containing a little sal soda.

The rule in relation to scalding the milk cans with boiling water should also apply to the milk pails and strainer.

DAILY AND WEEKLY CREAMERY

Why do we need the curd? To expel the whey readily. We must therefore cut it in our own sized pieces as possible. We first use the horizontal knife—then the perpendicular knife.
