THE CONVENTION.

Sixty-eight delegates put in an appearance in the Court room at 1 p. m. of Tuesday and the roll was called, developing the voters of the county.

There were some peculiar features in this primary, and there was some money squandered in it, but the defeated candidates swallowed their disappointment gracefully and there was no complaint.

On motion a committee consisting of Norman Boyer, E. H. Hutchinson, Ed. Lantz and C. F. Goring was appointed to tabulate and count the votes and authorized to declare the known result.

The resolutions Committee came in and their resolutions (as printed below) were read and adopted with the exception of the one relating to the date for the next Republican Primary.

Several of the candidates, who were present, were called upon for remarks, and Messrs Alexander, Tebay and Campbell made the most interesting remarks.

Then the convention which had been in session for several days, adjourned and the delegates lingered in front of the Court House where some of the candidates announced their intentions for the next election.

Thirty of the delegates were given tickets for the Saturday night party, that day, twenty at the Park, and twenty at the Lowry.
