Special to the Gazette. SHREVEPORT, La., June 9.—A year ago last April the postoffice here was robbed of a considerable amount in cash and postage stamps. A hole was chiseled through the floor of the vault, built of brick and concrete, once very thick. The size of this hole, however, and its jagged appearance precluded the idea of any one except a very small boy entering the vault by that means. Suspicion was directed against Professor Bristol, who was at that time money order clerk in the office. This gentleman is highly educated, a fine musician and a splendid business man. He lived well in the community, and had the full confidence of the then postmaster, Capt. Soape. What made the matter more suspicious was the fact that only these two knew the combination of the vault, and each had access to the inner safe. Professor Bristol went from here to Michigan, his old home, and from there to Point Clear, a fashionable summer resort near Mobile, Ala., where he was clerk in a leading hotel, but suspicion fastened upon him he was constantly shadowed during all these months, and when the time seemed ripe for decided action he was quietly arrested. Upon what evidence this arrest was made is not known to the public. It must have been something more tangible than mere suspicion. He waived preliminary trial and was brought here last night by a deputy United States marshal and lodged in jail. His trial is looked forward to with great interest, and developments of a most sensational character are expected. Mr. Bristol refused to be interviewed.
