THE STATE FAIR

The first exhibit of the Llano Estacado, the youngest agricultural country of the Union, entered the competitive field against the state at the tender age of two years, and carried off eleven premiums. The Amarillo was first on Carrots, Cabbage, Onions, Cucumbers and all kinds of Vegetables, and second on Turnips, Beets, Mediterranean Wheat and Barley on the premium list of the Dallas State Fair, and Potter County was awarded \$100 cash for its superior exhibit.
