GRAVES' RAY OF HOPE. An Old Deposit of \$10,000 Discovered. Destroys the Charge of Embezzlement—Barnaby's Account Square.

PROVINCENCE, R. I., Feb. 16.—A careful inquiry into the accounts and memoranda of Dr. Graves, at present at Canon City prison, Col., has revealed a deposit of some \$10,000.

With the \$10,000 which was on deposit in one of the national banks in Providence, the \$70,000 in securities which were turned over in Boston by Dr. Graves and Custodian Van Slyck, and the \$10,000 that has just come to light, it is said that the total amount will more than equal that claimed by the Barnaby family.

It was mixed up by the forgetfulness of Dr. Graves.

The \$10,000, it is said, is in a cash deposit and has been in the name of Mrs. Barnaby for a considerable time prior to her death in Denver.

Certificates of that deposit and of the stocks and securities purchased by Dr. Graves has just been forwarded to Wells, Mason & Furman, the attorneys for the condemned man, and they will be used in the efforts to secure a new trial.
